Directions to University of Bath:

There is a fast rail connection to Bath Spa station from London's Paddington station with two trains per hour during the day time and early evening. Travel time is about 2 hours and 20 minutes.

There is a connection from Heathrow airport to Paddington called Heathrow Connect. This 15 minute train leaves from Heathrow every 15 minutes and there are many signs on how to get to the platform (below ground) at the airport. Note this connection is **NOT** the London Underground which takes a different and longer route into the City.

If you are going direct to the University then it is best to take a Taxi because it is at the top of a hill. If you are going direct to one of the Hotels then you may be able to walk (Google the hotel and the train station). For a list of recommended hotels see the meeting invitation.

Bath is a campus University with most of its facilities organized around a central plaza. Our meetings will be held in the 8 East Building (8E) in Room 3.15
